RICS

To apply for APC final assessment interview, the scheme comprises of the following elements:

Part 1 – Submission requirements

You are required to submit 3 spiral bound copies of your final assessment submission. The submissions should contain all required templates, separated by dividers, and should be compiled in the following order:

- Candidate details
- Summary of experience
- Case study
- CPD record
- Log book

Part 2 – On-line ethics module and test

This is made up of three elements:

- The ethical standard and what they mean
- Real life ethical scenarios that members have faced
- A 20 question multiple choice test

Part 3 – Professional Interview (60 minutes)

HKIS - Quantity Surveying

Pursuant to APC, the scheme comprises of the following elements:

Part 1 Written Assessment

Half day written assessment work.

Part 2 The Final Assessment comprises

- Two half days work in an examination hall responding to written questions and
- A Professional Interview is required after passing the relevant Written Assessments. During the interview, the candidates will be given about 60 minutes to present technical and professional training gained over the training period.

HKIS - Building Surveying

Pursuant to APC, the structure scheme consists of the following components:

Self-Assessment Report (SAR)

At the end of every 9 months, candidates are required to submit a Self-Assessment Report to their counsellors for verification.

Practical Task

Normally lasts for four days. Day 1 will be given a briefing on details of the task including the building to be inspected and technical / professional assignment to be completed. Day 4 the candidates will return at an interview to present their findings and solutions to the assessors.

- Final Assessment

A summary of experience and Synopsis of Structural Learning are required to submit. At the final assessment interview, the candidates should demonstrate they have acquired sufficient knowledge and specialists in building surveying.

HKIS – General Practice

Part 1 Written assessment

Comprises 4 written examinations on the following subjects:

- Valuation (3.5hrs)
- Agency and Asset Management (2.5hrs)
- Laws related to General Practice Surveying (2.5hrs)
- Urban Land Economics (3 hrs)

Part 2 Professional Interview

Assessment takes the form of oral assessment by way of interview (about 60 minutes)
